How is Climate Change distracting agriculture?

Climate change is distracting agriculture by reducing a lot of food, wool, and other resources. Climate change is reducing food by destroying plants like grass, and cacti because cacti need a small amount of water. This is also forcing farmers to shift they area from long-term, sustainable productivity to immediate, reactive crisis management.

Why is this forcing shops to make food more expensive and scarcer?

Climate change is forcing shops to make food more expensive because of extreme weather events that are severely damaging crops and increasing production costs for farmers. Food prices have become more expensive and scarcer due to a "perfect storm" due to factors such as high input costs for producers, global supply chain disruptions, and corporate profit-seeking behaviors.

In what ways can extreme weather events disrupt food supply chains?

Weather events are destroying agricultural production. This is damaging critical logistics infrastructure (roads and ports). This is causing energy shortages that spoil perishable things such as eggs and yogurts.

The World Bank warns that climate change could make 132 million people poor by 2030 (4 more years from now). They warn because they rely on climate sensitive agriculture and lack resources to recover from disasters.
